The time has come to reflect on my first six months as IFLRY Vice President. In order to be able to assess my work and to hold me accountable, let me remind you of the three pillars that I was running on:

- · sharpening IFLRY's role as political platform
- · involvement of membership & feedback mechanisms
- · improvement of seminars/trainings/events

IFLRY as Political Platform

- i. IFLRY has been more vocal than ever. This becomes most evident when looking at our social media stream. You will instantly recognize that there is an unprecedented amount of political statements—ranging from the coup attempt in Turkey, to Brexit, to religious extremism in Bangladesh.
- ii. IFLRY has already broadened its scope and applied for an EYF grant with a work plan on **economic self-determination.** Seeing ourselves as an agenda-setter, we are trying to expand our seminar range to topics that are under-explored within our member base.
- iii. IFLRY has become the most vocal advocate of modern liberalism within the liberal family. By (constructively) criticizing the scope of the **LI manifesto**, we have not only earned a lot or reputation and respect, but are now considered as the leading force in developing a progressive, modern vision of political liberalism.

Membership Involvement & Feedback

i. In order to get direct feedback from our members, I have created a survey that posed questions regarding the political direction of IFLRY, and its programmes. The survey results will be presented at the EC and reflected in our political outlook and seminar offer.

Quality of Seminar Offer

- iv. Together with our Programme Manager for the Pool of Trainers, Tanya Lyubimova, I have not only selected a very capable team of new trainers, but we also developed a proposal for a **Training of Trainers**, which is currently under review with the EYF, to enhance the skills of our trainers in non-formal education.
- v. Further, we are currently developing a **360° feedback process** that allows us to evaluate the quality of our trainers and events on more objective grounds.
- vi. The content of our seminars is key. By introducing **unorthodox topics** such as the current theme of economic self-determination, we want to make IFLRY's seminars more original and relevant to the member base.
