MO Cooperation

Following a successful General Assembly and Executive Committee in Amman Jordan, where the participation, visibility and engagement of the representatives from the MENA region was evidently on the peak, I have continued to coordinate and foster the activities of the Arab Youth Union for Freedom and Democracy (AYUFD) including collaborating on the preparation and implementation of their annual work plan and events calendar.

I have lobbied to include the representative of the AYUFD to participate in the Liberal International Congress in Andorra as part of the IFLRY delegation, as well several people to attend the General Assembly in Thessaloniki, Greece.

I have been working with AYUFD on the international training in partnership with D66 on elections and election campaigning planned for August/September 2017. And we have been also exploring the possibility to organize further statutory event(s) in the MENA region alongside with the General Assembly of AYUFD.

In the footsteps of successful best practices of regional cooperation, I am happy we have managed to launch our IFLRY French Liberal Network uniting the francophone countries and organizations and providing an open platform for collaboration of organizations and individuals strengthening regional ties and empowering countries in Europe, Africa, MENA region etc. to be active in IFLRY. I hope for a very productive and long-term functioning of the Network.

Representation

As Vice President of IFLRY I have visited several events, including virtual presence - which is wonderfully possible through technology and our advancement as an aware Federation. I have spoken at the JNC Congress via Skype and conducted a visit to them in May. I will be happy to continue fostering MOs involvement and visiting congress and other events of our MOs to the best of my ability in the months to come, as I believe it is very important to see things on the ground and the real picture of what is happening in our MOs bringing the Federation closer to our members as an entity, and we as a Bureau have been trying to do so in the past year.

I have also represented IFLRY as part of our delegation to the Liberal International 70th Congress in Andorra, also facilited a side event organized by IFLRY on Millennials and Work: the Future of Employment.

I am joining my colleagues in the Bureau in celebration of the election of our Executive Director Andrea Ugrinoska into the Advisory Council on Youth for 2017-2018 and salute joint efforts in lobbying for IFLRY, for which I have also contributed by fostering agreements with IYDU and other colleagues in the international youth arena.

Non-Formal Education

I have been gladly continuing to be involved in IFLRY's NFE activities, both as a trainer and as an advisor to the Pool of Trainers, the latter especially in relation to involvement of young people from the MENA region both as trainers and participants, including recent events such as the Study Session on Migration in Strasbourg and the Seminar on Youth Autonomy in Thessaloniki.

For the Seminar in Greece I have also had a pleasure to work as part of the training team together with my colleagues preparing and delivering a training for young liberals which was organized in partnership with D66.

To continue IFLRY's active investment in strengthening the NFE within the Federation and building capacities of our trainers in the Pool, we are organizing a Training of Trainers 2.0 - an advanced week's long event in September, for which I am working together with the Pool of Trainers Manager as part of the Team.
