Welcome to the the 1st IFLRY x IDI Tolerance Conference. The aim of the Tolerance Conference is to practice, explore & discuss the role of **religious toleration** in the Open SocietyTM. The first edition will hereby focus on two very specific aspects of religious intolerance in modern societies: Islamophobia & Anti-semitism. According to the latest Eurobarometer survey on Anti-semitism in Europe, 89% of Jews in Europe feel that antisemitism has significantly increased in the last five years—while 97% (!) of the European population indicated that they are not well informed about Jewish history, customs, and practices. As a consequence, we see Jewish communities feeling left out of our pluralist societies and instead relocate to Israel. On a similar dimension, we can observe that one in three Muslims faces discrimination in Europe and that Islamophobia and the fear from Islam has become a viable and legitimate political tool for populists in Europe. By bringing together a diverse set of participants from the Arab World, Israel, Eastern Europe, and beyond we want to flesh out the roots of these hate-inducing practices and their politicalimplications today.
